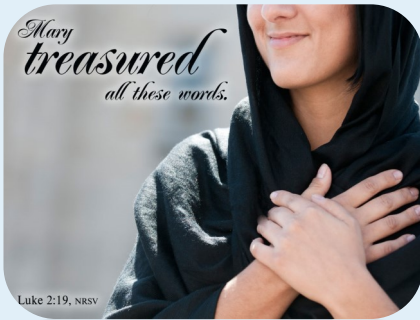

My oldest daughter recently bought herself a point and shoot film camera. As a dad, it has been fun teaching her things that I used to do without really thinking about it: Loading film into the camera, rewinding it, trying to capture a shot and then wondering for weeks (and sometimes months) what it would look like before the film was developed.

[The following excerpts are taken from "Before We Gather" by Zac Hicks. pp 165-167]

Lead a life worthy of your calling, for you have been called by God. Always be humble and gentle. Be patient with each other, making allowance for each other's faults because of your love. Make every effort to keep yourselves united in the Spirit, binding yourselves together with peace. For there is one body and one Spirit, just as you have been called to one glorious hope for the future. There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is over all, in all, and living through all. (Ephesians 4:1-6)

What qualifies us all to serve in ministry? Some of us are tempted to believe that ministry is something that only pastors and church staff do. But you're a Christian, the Bible considers you a minister. In Ephesians 4, when Paul is listing various roles in the church, he is quick to say that all those roles exist "to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ" (v 12). This means you've been given the Holy Spirit and his gifts so that you can minister to others. So no matter who you are—whether you're a musician, a greeter, a sound tech, a communion preparer, or an usher (to name a few)—you've been called to minister in that role. Your objective is to participate in your role in such a way that you are building other people up to look, smell, and act like Jesus. Don't shy away, then, from the opportunity to declare to your sisters and brothers the Word that has the power to build them up—the gospel. Remind them of who Jesus is and what he has done for them.

Choir Rehearsals begin Thursday, Sept. 5

- *Alleluia Ringers Handbell Choir* – 6:00-7:00pm. Meets in the sanctuary. Bell ringing technique can be easily taught in rehearsals, but you need to be able read music (especially counting and rhythm). This choir usually rings in both our styles of worship about once a month.
- *Adult Choir* – 7:15-8:30pm. Meets in the choir loft. This 4-part (SATB) choir is always needing more voices! No need to audition, just the love of singing. The choir sings at least twice a month in the 8:00 service and once a month in the 10:45 service.

- *Praise Team/Band* – Our on-going music team for the 10:45 Modern Worship is always looking for more members... Singers (lead or harmony) and band musicians (guitar, keys, drums, bass) are scheduled around availability (you do not need to commit to every week). Rehearsals are on Wednesdays at 7:30pm (after WOW) the week of the Sunday you are scheduled. Anyone is welcome to sit in on a rehearsal to see what is involved.
- *Tech Team* – Every worship service needs technicians to work in the tech booth running sound, screen, or cameras. If any of these positions interest you, please contact Linda. Training will be given and an optional small stipend is available.

FAITH IS ENROLLED IN THE DILLONS COMMUNITY REWARDS PROGRAM

Anyone with a Dillon's Shoppers Card can designate Faith Lutheran Church – Topeka (organization # CX912) as the reward recipient for their purchases. To designate Faith on your Shoppers Card account, go to www.dillons.com/communityrewards Sign into your Dillons account. Go to "Link your Card to an organization." Then click on "Search for your organization here."

On the next screen, in the field "Find an Organization", enter Faith Lutheran Church and press enter. Click on "Enroll" under the name "Faith Lutheran Church – Topeka". You will see a message you have successfully enrolled and you are finished. Shoppers Card holders must re-enroll annually to designate Faith in this program.

Hospice care. Palliative care. What exactly do these mean? Let's start at the beginning, when hospice care and palliative care were born.

Connecticut Hospice was America's first hospice. It was founded by Florence Wald and a group of nurses, doctors, and clergy in the 1970's. It was the first of its kind in the United States. Wald had been inspired by Dr. Cicely Saunders during a lecture about palliative care. Saunders was the founder of the first hospice in the world. The hospice movement focused on patients with terminal illness and their families. "In the early days terminally ill patients went through hell, and the family was never involved," Wald said. She developed a home hospice program that centered on 10 Principles of Care that delivered coordinated, comprehensive, and compassionate care for patients with terminal illness and their families. The 10 Principles are:

- 1) The patient and family are regarded as the unit of care.
- 2) Services are physician directed and nurse coordinated.
- 3) Emphasis is on control of symptoms (physical, sociological, spiritual, and psychogenic.
- 4) An interdisciplinary team provides care.
- 5) Trained volunteers are an integral part of the team.
- 6) Services are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week, and on call with emphasis on availability of medical and nursing skills.
- 7) Family members receive bereavement follow up.



- 8) Home care and inpatient care are coordinated.
- 9) Patients are accepted on the basis of health needs, not on ability to pay.
- 10) There are structured systems for staff support and communication.

The main hospice commitment is to enable the patient to live as fully and completely as possible during the time of illness. The full family is considered in the care, not just the patient. Hospice care can make it possible for families to keep their loved one at home in some cases. Community resources can help deepen support and keep care costs as low as possible. Because hospice care is an approach to care and is not tied to a specific facility it can be offered at home or in a facility...a nursing facility, a hospital, or a hospice center.

Next month we will explore Palliative Care and how it relates to Hospice Care. My intention is to help us understand what a patient and their family is going through and what services/type of care the patient is receiving when they are under hospice care or palliative care. However, much searching of information has cemented my belief that it is a daunting, if even possible, task to definitively differentiate between the two types of services. The care provided and the terminology used when providing these services is not standardized. Not all organizations provide the same care for each of these services. For this reason, it is very important to discuss with the physician and representatives of either of the services being considered before making a decision on what type of care best suits your specific situation.

MONTHLY FINANCIAL RESULTS (GENERAL FUND)

- Donations for July were \$73,942 and expenses were \$90,358 resulting in a **net negative** balance for the month of (\$16,416.)

- Year to date donations are \$676,996 and expenses were \$647,682 resulting in a year to date balance of \$29,314.
- Donations for July were \$8,089 below July 2023 .
- Year to date donations are \$51,993 above 2023.
